

President's Report

CPCC 2010/11 'MWCA Club Champions' – It's been fifty years since we've been able to say that. If that wasn't enough, CPCC also collected the MWJCA Club Championship completing 'The Double'. No other Club has ever achieved this.

If one highlight is to be selected from this past season, full as it was of activity & triumph, I would have to say that it would be this. For many years our Senior teams have battled away, picking up the odd premiership here and there but probably not being suitably rewarded for the sweat and toil, and our strength on average across the grades. There has been a number of reasons for this. Whilst we encourage players to play at the highest level according to their ability, CPCC has not imposed selection on its squads. The result is the talent usually gets spread thinly across the grades as players gravitate towards their mates and a few key central team organisers/captains. We end up with a good number of vibrant, enthusiastic squads comprising loyal, long serving clubmen but less in terms of silverware compared to some other clubs. Then there is the situation where the MWCA Club Championship was not awarded for the period between 1983/84 and 2009/10. I am sure CPCC would have picked up a number of Championships during this period, particularly in the late 90s early 2000s. Back when we last won the Championship in 61/62 it was known as the Onoto Pen Trophy and highly prized. Well done to the Association for re-instating this award and now that the Club Championship is back we will be doing our bit to celebrate our win and to re-build its prestige in the minds of all Clubs.

In terms of the Junior Club Championship, it is perhaps even more significant. A little over ten years ago CPCC were told by the Association that we would not be allowed entry into the next competition due to low team numbers. Now, we are Club Champions and producing many representative players.

The diverse and extensive level of activity from last season continued on this year with the entry and operation of 6 senior and 16 junior teams in the MWCA competitions, 'Milo' junior Intro to Cricket sessions, a senior T20 team and an over 40's Masters team. Added to this regular schedule was the Kookaburra Cup Junior Tournament in Canberra and the usual social matches including Father/Son/Daughter, Double Wicket Competition and Ashes Tour Match. The FSD and Double Wicket Comp games were both held on Australia Day with great success so we expect this Double Header to become a regular fixture on this day.

Our junior development and re-building program has almost reached maximum capacity and its success is now well and truly evident. Following up on our 7th Grade team's Premiership last season, our 6th Grade team (same concept but one grade up due to less grades) made it back-to-back victories for our development squad. The mix of experience and youth is providing ideal with a number of our 16/17s starring in the afternoon Senior ranks. Several players from last season's 7th moved up into 3rds and 2nds with Dave Le and Jeff Porter-Denning making debuts in 1sts. The flow on effect into the Senior ranks has grown from a trickle to a flood with the Club now faced with the prospect of clearing room in the lower grades to accommodate the expected numbers coming up from the Junior ranks. A great problem to have.

We received news early in the new year that shocked us all. Tim Carpenter, regular 3rd grader and all round good guy had suffered a brain aneurism and was fighting for his life in ICU. From this dire situation, Carpo has defied the odds and I can report that Carpo is making as good a comeback as can possibly be expected. We wish Tim all the very best for the rest of the road to recovery and we look forward to having him back involved in Club activity.

To have all six senior teams make the finals was a brilliant effort in all departments. Before the start of each season, much lobbying and debating occurs before we settle on the number and grades of teams. This is not always done to the satisfaction of everyone but at least this season the results worked out in our favour. I need to make special mention of the 2nd Grade squad. It was unanimous amongst the Committee that the next road for our young players was to form a 3rd Grade development team. This left the bulk of the previous years 3rd Grade in limbo when the Association axed one grade from the previous year. We were left with six teams for six grades, but no team we considered strong enough for 2nds. Darren McDermott's old 3rds were given the tough assignment of 2nd Grade and I feared that it wasn't going to be much fun for them. Fortunately we picked up youngsters Dan Schimek,,Nick Armstrong and Jack Ross together with English Internet signings Stuart Love and Nick Jago just prior to the start. The 2nds went off like a rocket winning the first few games outright and leading the field for most of the season. Well done chaps on a splendid effort and to all teams for great competitive effort.

Two individual performances/achievements slipped through unacknowledged at the Presentation events. Firstly, young gun Matt Terry became the first CPCC player to score 1000 runs in a season – an amazing feat. Matt batted extremely well in the U16/17s, 6th Grade and T20 competitions to compile 1003 runs at an average of 50.15. I'd be surprised if this record was surpassed anytime soon. Secondly, and at the other end of the spectrum, Dave Quarford reached the milestone of 400 games. Perhaps Freddy can now be classified as a Super-Stalwart?

A new look Association committee was installed this season with CPCC heavily involved through Brenden Ball (MWCA Vice President) and Dom Wheeler (Delegate). They have brought a much needed business approach to the operations of the MWCA and we are seeing the improvements, particularly in terms of communication, due process and innovation. We look forward to working with this committee on improving the overall lot of park cricketers over the next few years.

CPCC have been successful in receiving capital assistance grants from the Warringah Council and the State Government to enable the renovation of the derelict tennis shed on Plateau Park. We hope to have this operating as a storage and kitchenette facility for trainings and matches during the 2011/12 season. On other matters relating to Council, the proposed 'User Pay' increases to sporting groups will add further pressure to CPCC's financial operating model. We are currently heavily reliant upon the money received from the Brookvale Hotel to cover the operating loss of revenue over expenditure. For the past few seasons CPCC have been subsidising junior and senior ground levies imposed by the Associations (for which we have received several new pitches) and a dramatic increase in umpires fees for the seniors (for which we have received many more umpires). For financial security, we need to address this and our options are fee increases and/or greater fund raising activity.

It will be a big challenge to match the heights of this past season in 2011/12 however our fundamentals and depth are strong across the Club so the upcoming season is eagerly awaited.

Secretary's Report

The 2010/11 season will be remembered as a truly amazing Season. Last year there were only 2 CPCC teams in the finals. This year we were back with a vengence. All 6 Senior teams were in the finals, so our hopes were high of some fantastic outcomes for the season. And the outcomes were absolutely fantastic. Dual Premierships, Club Champions in both Senior and Junior competitions, T20 Plate winners, a "Rising Star" Award to a very promising young batsman Dan Schimek & finally, Association Awards to Nick Beaton, President Huxley and myself. So, as I said, a truly amazing Season indeed. Never before have we had more than one Premiership in the same season. Congratulations to Doug Wiles & Angus MacKenzie, our Captains of the 5th and 6th Grade Premiership winning teams. Both teams have followed up on excellent performances from the season before. Dougs team were Runners Up last year, so to continue the momentum with a Premiership is a great achievement. Angus' team had the same core players that won 7th grade last year, which is a terrific tribute to the success of the Junior Development program. Congratulations also to the other captains and teams on excellent seasons & for making the Semi finals. The atmosphere back at the Brookvale Hotel was electric when we found out that all teams were in the finals. Juniors - I keep thinking "How can the Juniors get any better?", but they do. Club Champions of the Manly Warringah Junior Cricket Association is a great achievement. CPCC fielded another 16 teams this season. Collaroy Plateau Static U/16 finished the season on top of the table. I am concerned that we will lose many of our talented cricketers to the Manly Districts Pathway Program. We will happily welcome back any player who tries the program & finds out that Shires or Grade cricket is not all that's it's cracked up to be. Thankyou to all the hard working volunteers who have built up the number of junior cricketers @ CPCC over the last 15 years.

Financial - The club also recorded a great result in the financial side of things this year. Our esteemed President Mr Huxley secured a government grant of over \$6k to assist us with converting the Plateau Park tennis shed into something useful for the cricketing folk. Due to a clerical error on the governments behalf, we have been inadvertantly paid this amount twice, which we will have to pay back, meanwhile the Club is enjoying a rather large bank balance. Ball purchasing remains a large outlay for the club, part of our profit this year is due to be paid for purchasing dozens of balls in the near future. Our fearless Treasurer Toby Horstead has yet again done a marvellous job recording the Clubs finances.

CPCC Presentation Night - With a year like this, the Presentation Night promised to be another sensational night, and it was. The Brooky Hotel was again packed with plenty of Plateau players, Life Members & trophies. Incredible overall results always translates to incredible individual stats. The Senior batsmen scored 17 centuries and the bowlers claimed 6 wickets/innings 10 times with Mick Mackin and Matt Richards both claiming 10 wickets in a match. Ewen Chung had another great season with a haul of 8/36, an innings of 151 and the Clubs highest ever partnership of 258 with Blake Conde, topping each of those categories. Andrew Coates and myself laid claim to the Double Wicket trophy.

MWCA Presentation Night - The MWCA changed the format & venue of the MWCA Presentation Night. Secretary Steve Shepard & Matt Meers played co-hosts at a much more formal evening at the Steyne Hotel in Manly this year. Clearly a great deal of thought had gone into the evening at which CPCC picked up more that it's fair share of awards. Our table was glittering with silverware, shields and trophies won on individual, team and club levels. Congratulations and gratitude must go to the entire MWCA Committee for the effort and time put in at the Association. They have made some big changes and they cannot be thanked enough for what they have achieved. A special mention of thanks to our Delegates Brenden Ball & Dom Wheeler for the commitment they have made at Association. To have someone at the Association level representing the club is invaluable and the club extremely appreciates the efforts made.

Social Scene - If we are Club Champs of the MWCA, we are definitely Club Champs of the social scene. The Golf Day had to be delayed due to the lack of Sunday availability. The British Theme at the Xmas Party was a great night. Pete Henriksen did as good a job as Sid Vicious as he did dressed as Jesus, many moons ago. Brendo won the male category as King Arthur and Steve Albanese won the female category as Scary Spice (yes, very scary). The Nelson Bay trip attendence and entertainment value remains high. Some of golfs "finest" moments can be witnessed at the Nelson Bay Golf Club on the Friday. There's the usual Poker comp and for the sleep deprived there's always the snoring comp. Next year we'll be adding the Tobbogan Run and Murrays Brewery to an already packed agenda.

The Olympic Season 2000/01 was a highly significant year for the club. Now ten years on we celebrate the anniversary of the A1s historic Grand Final victory. This was the club's first outright A1 victory ever as John Wellburn's 1971/72 Premiers shared the spoils with Manly Leagues. It was a huge weekend for the Club as next door on Nolans 2 and 4, our A2 and B1 teams were also engaged in Grand Finals, albeit unsuccessfully. Apart from Senior success, season 00/01 also saw the club's website up and running and a memorable social scene.

The story of the year was without doubt the A1s. Quoting from the 46th Annual Report: "On Sunday the 25th of May, 2001 at approx 4:30pm, Pete Henriksen clean bowled Seaforth Cricket Club's no.11 to claim a Grand Final victory by 97 runs". The team's run to the Grand Final included Dave Sharp taking 9 for 28, the second best figures in club history and Rob Minnett's 144 being his highest score for the club. Adding another symbolic element to the victory was the involvement of Rob Minnett, Bob Vere & Col Huxley who all started their careers together in the Frank Stanton coached Under 10s many years before.

All four senior teams made the finals. If the Club Championship had not been dormant it most certainly would have been Collaroy's. Matt Kehoe's Minor Premier A2s and John Jackson's B1s also made the Grand Final, batted first and floundered. Interestingly in the B1s, Plateau opener Greg Luckman was clean bowled second ball by Seaforth's demon bowler Adam Peacock. Ironically, Adam was part of CPCC's victorious 5th Grade team this current season. Dean Storey's B3s were building strength but couldn't advance past Manly Leagues in the semi. They did produce the Bruce Shearer winner in Rob Chessell and a hattrick to Alex McGee.

The Juniors had grown to six teams with Saturday Morning Secretary Vicki Carden commenting in her report that it wasn't proving to be "too much work". I wonder if

she feels the same now we have twenty junior teams. Sadly life member Ken Cunningham passed away aged 73. Ken suffered from a disability but this did not stop him assisting and supporting Club teams over many years.

Finals success usually translates into a big Nelson Bay weekend and 00/01 ranks as possibly the biggest of all time. It was so big a bus was hired to transport everyone up and back. Whilst the B3s didn't win a premiership, their performance on the Nelson Bay RSL nightclub dance floor was worthy of a trophy.

The season also saw Rob Minnett pass Don Leech's long-standing record of most runs for the Club 5405, but even this feat was almost overshadowed by his rendition of Rhinestone Cowboy (WHPB) at the Christmas Dinner held at the Golden Singapora. Other major award winners were Andrew Macleman as usual taking out the Armstrong, Matt Kehoe the Golf Day and a young Nick McLachlan winning the Spencer Bennett Fast Bowler Trophy. Nick is now a Manly 2nd grade regular. All of this was celebrated at the Dee Why Hotel.



The 'Randolph Beddows' Flag

Randolph Beddows is well known in Manly Warringah cricket circles, particularly amongst the First Graders. There is no keener cricketer in the District than Randy. Whether it has been following Martin Shield, the old Forest Hawks, Balgowlah or of late Harbord Bowling teams, Randolph has been a regular on the sidelines for years. Given a chance to field for any team who was short, Randolph would be out like a shot invariably to fine leg. Otherwise, he's more than happy to have a chat and reminisce.

In 2004 Randolph returned a piece of CPCC history he had been custodian of for 25 years. The small flag, one of many which used to be attached to wooden stakes and employed as boundary markers, was left behind after a match in the late 60's. It is the last known survivor.

It was decided to honour the first grade player with the highest 'Shearer' Points total for the season with the creation of this trophy.



2nd Grade

Season 2010/11 was a remarkable year for many reasons for the CPCC 2nd Grade Team. There was talk amongst other clubs that the bubble might have burst but we were having none of that and got back to our winning ways at The Home Of Cricket, aka The Most Picturesque Ground In The World, aka Vic Huxley Oval with a crushing win in the local derby match against Cromer in Round 7. There were many stars that day and it was a real team victory but it would be remiss of me not to thank our talisman, our hired gun from First Grade --- Secretary Minnett --- who, as well as taking a couple of sharp catches at First Slip, made game turning contributions of 2 and 4 with the bat that really helped seal this victory and we are two victories from two matches with Rob in our ranks.

We finished 2010 on a high with a strong win in the Round 8 one dayer with our bowlers knocking over Belrose for 46. Pick of the bowlers was Nick Armstrong who, while he only took one wicket opening the bowling (1-12 off 7 straight overs) bowled with great control, pace and bounce in his best spell of the season and a spell that set Belrose on the back foot for the other bowlers to feed off. We followed it up with strong one day wins in Round 9 and 10. One of the highlights was the emergence of another Pom, Stuart Love, taking 5-13 against Long Reef at Griffith with one of the best displays of swing bowling seen for many a day and there was even talk of him being "The New GB".

Round 11 saw us taste defeat for the first time in 2011, and again we were beaten by North Steyne. In Round 12 we steadied the ship with a fantastic draw against Harbord Diggers. We won the toss and fielded first and had them 2/16 when their batsman knicked one only to be given not out by the umpire. To be fair to the ump, our bowler didn't hear the knick either (we think due to a truck driving past at Nolans) but when that batsman went on to score a century in a team total of 8 dec 301, it might be suggested that we could be forgiven for dropping our bundle and surrendering meekly but with Andrew Cameron digging in and leading from the top of the order, we held on for 70 overs to claim the draw and the competition lead with two rounds to go.

We made 257 runs batting first in Round 13 with Daniel Schimek scoring a long overdue century, finishing with 121. After solid batting all season everyone in the team was really happy to see him join the CPCC Centurions Club in his first year at the club. Unfortunately poor catching and fielding cost us that match and Harbord Bowling made us pay. We bowled them out for 160 and gave ourselves a slim chance by putting on 7 dec 140 off 23 overs but it wasn't to be and North Steyne got the runs to end our season.

Freddy Quarford probably being underbowled due to the number of bowlers we had but still showing there's plenty of life in the old dog with hauls of 5/33, 4/17, 3/2.....Darren McDermott taking 30 catches and 3 stumpings.....and while we were disappointed to bow out the way we did, for a team that would have considered it a very successful year if we'd have just scraped into the semi-finals, having the season we did was a great way to spend the summer and I can't wait to give the 2nd Grade title a real shake next year with the experience of this year under our belts.

Lastly, as well as our twelve guys named above, special thanks must also go to our 13th team member, Michael Armstrong, who filled in at the drop of a hat whether it be to play a full match, one day of a match or just 15 overs to fill in for someone that had to leave early or arrive late.

- Round 7 vs Cromer Moore's 7/54 and 53* along with Rob Steel's 55 set up for a thrilling 2nd innings finish against the top side, after having given away 28 runs on the first innings.
- Round 8 (one-dayer) vs DY RSL chasing 231 off 35 overs, we managed to score the runs in 28.4 overs thanks largely to Matt Moore (63*), Blake Conde (57) and Ewen Chung's blistering start at the top of the order of 43.
- Round 9 (one-dayer) vs Wakehurst I could go on and on about this, however, the short of it is: Ewen Chung (151) & Blake Conde (97) managed to combine at the top of the order for a club record opening partnership of 258 before both fell, and CPCC ended the innings at 4/280. - Round 13 vs Harbord Bowling Chung (35), Eade (32) and Moore (29) were the only ones to score above 10 in our innings, which left us at 144, and convincingly beaten despite Faulkner's 2/10.
- Round 14 vs Cromer Our victory over top side Cromer denied them the Minor Premiership. Raj (3/16), Rohanek (3/50) and Moore (3/50) shared the wickets whilst Chung (49) and James Humberstone (39) scored the runs.

With my 3 year tenure as Captain now up, I would like to thank all those at the Club for their support and guidance, in particularly James Humberstone who takes on more than just a Vice Captain role. 
