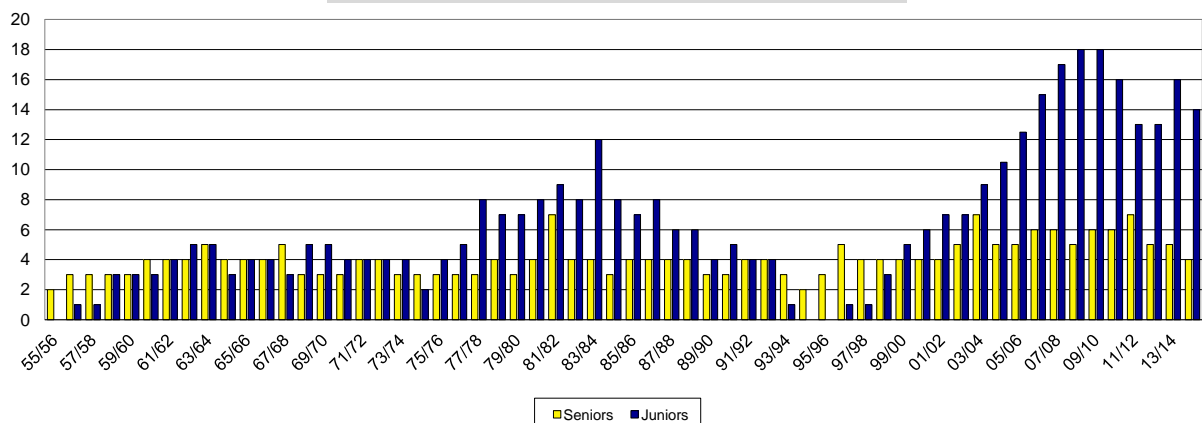

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The Club's sixtieth season was worthy of our long and successful existence both as a participant in Manly Warringah cricket associations and a valuable local community institution. Sixtieth season celebrations were highlighted by two great events, the Anniversary Dinner at Long Reef Golf Club and the Cricket Festival day at Vic Huxley Oval, Plateau Park. The cricket year was crowned by the on field success of our President's Cup (7th Grade) premiership, four Junior premierships, a Junior Club championship and another stunning MWCA T20 title.

The two signature events for the 60th Season were held with great success. On February 14, the 60th Anniversary Dinner took place at the Long Reef Golf Club. Around 100 people, including past and present players, parents, partners and guests of honour including Warringah Mayor Michael Regan and his partner Bronwyn, came together in this stunning location to reminisce about cricket and life on and around the Plateau, and to celebrate the Club's history and success over six decades. Whilst the usual suspects were behind most of the organisation, I'd especially like to thank MC for the evening Kim Blacker, and Lou and Mike Baber for adding their talents to the organising committee.

Two weeks later, the 'Cricket Festival' was held at Plateau Park on Sunday February 22. Clear blue skies ensured the day would be a great success if the cumulation of cricketing talent for the T20 main event didn't. I was as honoured to play alongside the likes of ex-Australian Test player Matt Nicholson, ex-NSW player Marty Haywood, ex-CPCC Presidents and club stalwarts as I was proud to see the array of club juniors lined up opposite as part of the Junior Secretary's XI. All of these excellent young cricketers have done the club proud through their progress into Manly Grade or senior park cricket, as well as developing into fine young men. Additional satisfaction was gained through the narrow victory achieved by the President's XI to show that the young guys have a bit to learn yet (you still can't beat experience). With a major focus of the day being a Pink Stumps fundraiser, it was a brilliant moment when Pink Stumps Foundation Director and very local resident Tracey Bevan inadvertently walked past and took the opportunity to address the crowd at the conclusion of the match. The day couldn't have gone any better and once again thanks to all those who pitched in to help. Particular thanks to Nick Govers from Cricket NSW for all his participation and contribution.



CPCC Junior Jack Ritchie

CPCC started with Juniors and they have formed the foundation of the Club ever since. I am sure that our founding fathers Vic Huxley and Chip Browne would have been proud to see CPCC junior product Jack Ritchie winning the Benaud Medal this season. Jack was voted best player in the Sydney 1st Grade Grand Final when Manly Waratahs defeated Bankstown to win their first title in 26 years. Together with the 1st grade bowling performances of another CPCC product Nick McLachlan, this was a strong and appropriate symbol of our Club's efforts over time. Future Benaud medal winners and Manly rep players are no doubt being churned out by Marty Haywood and Junior Development Coach John Jackson's school holiday camps. We are so fortunate to have this type of experience and motivation within the Club to enable us to run these courses. Thanks Gents.

Whilst we mostly celebrated, the season also gave cause to stop and mourn the passing of several cricketers, each one significant to our game in their own right. Phil Hughes' tragic death rocked every cricketer to their core, making us question the very reasons we play the game, how we play it and the risks involved. It was soon apparent that it was a freak accident, and the reflection only made us realise how much we cherish playing the game and how strong the cricket community is as we shared the grief. Ritchie Benaud has represented summer and cricket for so many years that it is hard to imagine the two without him. As highly regarded as a cricketer and person as anyone

to have played the game, Ritchie will be greatly missed. Finally and more closely associated with the Club, CPCC lost one of our 'Originals' when Norm Stephensen passed away during the season. Norm took to the field as part of the 3rd Grade XI at Dee Why Oval, the first senior mens team in the Club's history.

Anyone who was at Balgowlah Oval for the T20 final replay when CPCC played Cromer witnessed as amazing a game as you are ever likely to see. Our T20 '1sts' are a powerful symbol of the Club's strength when we can put together a team of our best players drawn from both Park and Grade teams. To see the likes of young rep players including Harrison Dunn, Arb Virdi, Aaron Peters, Jake Carden and Nick McLachlan (even if he is coming off 5 paces bowling spin) playing together with Park regulars like Rob Minnett, Ryan Dunn and Dave Le is very satisfying. To watch Nick Bonner & Dan Schimek display their incredible talents when they tee'd off in the final to chase down Cromer's massive 198 total was electrifying. Well done to master planner Dave Le for assembling and coordinating such a great squad and we look forward to watching more in the seasons to come. With the T20 format becoming more popular every season, it's a great achievement to have our Club's name on the Mike Pawley T20 trophy 3 times already.

It wouldn't have been a typical CPCC season without some form of controversy but unfortunately one matter the Club had to deal with was as dark an issue as we've encountered in our 60 years. In the last days of the 2013/14 season a CPCC player was involved in an incident against an opponent that resulted in assault charges being laid against our player. This was unprecedented not only in CPCC history, but also the MWCA. Whilst it is regrettable our Club's proud name was associated with such an event, all-appropriate actions were taken, the player stood down and the matter was eventually heard by the MWCA during the 14/15 season. A lengthy suspension for the individual was the result.

It seems like our Tourists have only just returned from the 'summer of the century' 2014 England Tour as Sri Lanka 2016 looms large on the horizon. Our committed touring committee has been hard at it and another strong touring party has been assembled and are set to experience a fabulous itinerary. A possible stop in Singapore for Anzac Day will be an extra-special touch and I'm sure an unforgettable day.

We are only able to push on beyond 60 seasons as a strong, developing Club thanks to the dedicated work of your volunteer committee. Whilst we are all still well and truly engaged in the Club, this committee is now entering its second decade of shouldering the considerable workload of both Junior and Senior club management. Please get involved where you can. Any assistance will help us share the load and be better prepared to pass on responsibilities when required. Finally, a big thankyou to sponsors Lateral Estate, the Brookvale Hotel and Paladin Sports for their continuing support of the club. Their assistance allows our Club to provide a level of service to our players second to none in our district and to look professional every time we take the field.

I look forward to sharing with you our 61st season this summer.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Another successful year at Collaroy with our 7th Grade Team claiming back the Premiership title they lost last year. Our T20 and Masters teams also did extremely well. The T20 side of incredible young cricketers, easily chased down the required 200 runs. We reached the total in only 16.5 overs. Unfortunately our 3 top Senior Grades all lost their Semi Finals games. First Grade were going extremely well all season despite player shortages. Those player shortages along with some close umpiring decisions, brought the season to a premature end. The Masters Team defeated Mosman who had not lost a Masters game since they joined the competition 3 year ago & CPCC were on top of the Table for a major part of the season until 2 losses late in the season saw them finish 3rd. Juniors - 14 CPCC Junior teams hit the local parks this season with Under 10, 11, 12 & 13 winning their respective grades. Kanga cricket also continues to entertain the future CPCC Bradman & Lillee cricketers alike. We continue to need volunteers to run this extremely important part of the club. Pathway cricket is attracting the resources of junior cricketers. This is having an impact on Saturday afternoon cricket and we need to remain focused on developing our young talent to keep Park cricket strong in Manly Warringah.

Financial - The Clubs finances are still in extremely safe hands under the control of Treasurer Tobes. The Fees will only increase slightly this year but we will need to keep tighter control on Fee collection which continues to be the toughest part of the Treasurer role. The Brookvale Hotel has approached us to continue the decade long partnership with CPCC. Long standing plans to develop the Hotel look to get underway in the coming season and CPCC will be losing the use of the Log Room. I may make another attempt to procure a Log for use in the CPCC museum.

Sri Lanka Tour - Plans are well under way for 14 CPCC Tourists to tour Sri Lanka in April 2016. With our first 3 tours all in England, it was time to explore another part of the world. Eight games are scheduled across Galle, Kandy & Colombo. Thanks to John Jackson for organising the fixtures and finances, in what looks to be another fun and "fine" filled 3 weeks. The Tour will end in Singapore at the end of April with an Anzac day game against ex-pat Mark Christensen's Misfit Team.



Social Scene - No matter what the on-field exploits are like at CPCC, the off-field performances are always excellent. There's nothing like the wind in your hair at the Nelson Bay Go Karts, even if you are wearing a gigantic crash helmet. March & April 2016 looks to be thoroughly booked out with Grand Final Weekend and Easter occupying the last 2 weeks of March. The first week of April contains the 20th Anniversary visit to Nelson Bay & everyone is invited. The second weekend is the departure date for Sri Lanka.

Good luck to everyone for the coming season. Please keep on the lookout for players. We are committed to keeping CPCC strong in MWCA.

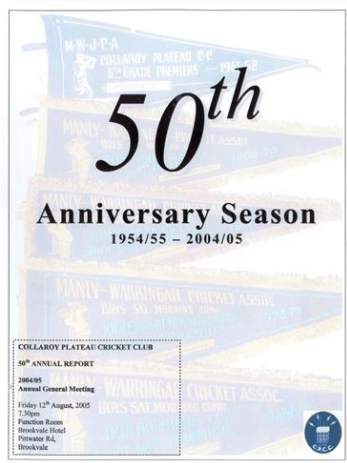

TEN SEASONS AGO



Season 2004/05 marked the 50th Anniversary of the Collaroy Plateau Cricket Club. This significant occasion was celebrated by a Dinner at the DYRSL club where 160 past and present members of the Club came together to celebrate fifty years of cricket on the Plateau. Four of the original senior team Frank Huxley, Milton Lidgard, Ken Hunt and Norm Stephenson were in attendance as was Ross Fairhall, a member of the Boys team that took the field on that first Saturday in 1955. President Huxley recounted the Club's beginnings and noted the increased value of the real estate on the Plateau whilst Mike Rohanek's band entertained the crowd and Bob Williams capped the England bound tourists.

Whilst there were no senior Premierships to celebrate the 50th with, two of the five senior teams made the semis. Dean Storey's B1s, attempting to go back to back, lost out due to a tie in the semi after a direct hit run out as they were going for the winning run. Michael Letts threatened the club record at one stage with 159 at Dee Why. The season highlights for John Jackson's B2s was James Humberstone's 6-53 to win the game with his dad (out from England) fielding at square leg. Jacko and Englishman Ed Wright put on a match winning partnership of 156 in another game. The A1s lost Dave Sharp for the year due to work and Dave Moss couldn't bowl due to a shoulder injury – they were the top opening bowler combination in the MWCA the season previous. Matt Moore came in and was relied upon heavily in his one and only season in 1st Grade. Pete Henriksen broke his collarbone in a game that would become known as the 'Miracle by the Lake'. Playing short, the Towers restricted Seaforth to 208. With nine wickets down and only a few to get, Henrikson came in swathed in bandages and held up one end left handed whilst Greg Luckman hit the winning runs. Despite the heroics, the team would finish last. The B3s were captained by

The club's first official neck tie was unveiled at Chris Arcus' wedding in Cowra. The Nelson Bay touring party cheered on James Scholtens from their chairs at the Shoal Bay country club as he refereed the Shute Shield match between Warringah and West Harbour on ABC live TV. The first of many presentation nights was held in the Brookvale Hotel function room. Warringah Shire Council, otherwise know as Dick Persson at this time, unveiled a disturbing plan to pave Nolans and turn it into a netball complex. CPCC were active in letter writing and demonstrations which persisted until common sense prevailed.

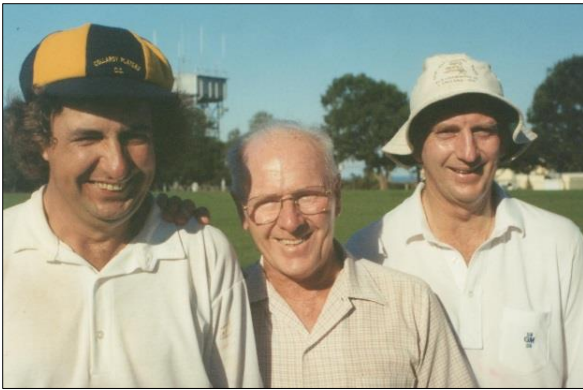

The President's Golf Day was won at Long Reef by the now current President, holding off an 18th fairway challenge from Greg Bruckard. David Quarford's A1s were quite a force after being joined by the young and successful A2 team from previous seasons. Thirty Seasons Ago – 1984/85

Forty Seasons Ago – 1974/75

The 1974-75 Season led by President Bert Elsworthy and new Secretary Alistair Grigg saw the Club with 5 teams A2, B1, C2, U/10, U/12 entered for competition. More established players had retired as had happened in the previous year and all teams contained many new faces, including Spen Bennett. Separate Trophy Presentation and Annual General meeting nights had not increased attendances and the committee was faced with finding an alternative.

Bert took the Presidency for the next season but Alistair continued to a record breaking six seasons stint as Secretary. – Milton Lidgard

Fifty Seasons Ago – 1964/65

Season 1964/5 was a season that didn't bring home the lustre of the previous one. Only Ken Hunt's "D" grade team starred by winning a premiership. Individual efforts were plentiful with Plateau fielding two "A" grade teams following the previous years success, the club reserves of grit and determination was well and truly dented. It is extremely difficult for any club to field two "A" grade sides and Collaroy Plateau and Manly Leagues cricket clubs have a massive administrative task compared with one or two team clubs. Season 64/65 was a difficult year for the club administration.

Paul Spraggs became the first Plateau resident to win the Bruce Shearer Memorial Trophy. Paul went on to Manly first grade and is now playing with Marlboro. Our first single wicket contest was played before a good audience. Jack Eaton took the trophy. The present Captain of Warringah Rugby team, Rod McQueen, was one of Ken Hunt's players in C1. Brian Tapp managed to injure his back in a car accident, made a quick recovery and played the last part of the season.

Ken Hunt's executive committee that year was Don Leech Secretary, Vic Huxley Treasurer, John Welburn, Bert Ellsworthy, Peter Bell, the late Larry Bell, Frank Huxley, with Jack Eaton Publicity Officer.

Twenty-six members played in the A2 team, an indication of a difficult season. The very popular Dave Whitson demonstrated his bowling prowess with four caught and bowled in one innings. In a few seasons Dave gathered 1000 runs and 100 wickets. Don Leech, the A2 Captain established a Club record score of 148 not out. In the C1 team, Bob Williams took five wickets in an over, without taking a hat trick. Eric Tazelaar made 103 in heat wave conditions playing against Wanderers. The now Manly Soccer player Alan Crawford made 107 in a superb innings.

Foundation members Ken Hunt, Barry Harland and Peter Bond played their last full season of cricket although Ken has continued as no.1 club reserve playing most Saturdays, without being selected in a team, merely registered. Alan Fairhall's Aubreen Street garage was the "Hut" and many good Saturday evenings were held. Daylight saving seems to have changed summer Saturday nights for cricketers. On the Association front Des. Sainsbury and Alex Anderson were administrators supreme, ably assisted by publicity officer Cecily Taylor soon to be followed by Maurice Murray. – Milton Lidgard

Sixty Seasons Ago – 1955/56

Our two esteemed foundation members, Vic Huxley and Chip Browne have completed ten seasons of executive effort and playing performances. They have established a record of service, being the foundation President and Secretary of our first organisation, the Collaroy Plateau Boys Club, and have held club executive positions continuously, and a record of field performances that will stand for years to come.

The club was established in 1955 as an activity of the Collaroy Plateau Baptist Church for the local youth. Vic and Chip were experienced players of other clubs, Vic from Mona Vale and Chip from Wyola Club and were allowed to play in the 5th Grade with our local boys, together with Pastor Cawley. The team included Bruce Shearer, Don Roberts who later became Vic's son-in-law, Peter Browne, Jim Pickworth, Don Easton, Mick Redden, Dennis Robbie, Les Rodgers, Alan Waite, Neil Walker, Col Williams of Joe Trotters Butchery, and John Blue and Norma Robbie (Scorer). Also a demon speed bowler Ray Norton, who terrified opposing batsman, and Vic and Chip as the score mounted by wides and leg byes for four runs. The team finished second to the Manly-Warringah District side, with Mick Redden winning an Association trophy with 46 wickets. Vic Huxley took 41 wickets at 11.4 average including 7-17 and 6-10 and scored 460 runs. Geoff (Chips) Browne scored 683 runs, including 92*, 85, 82, 80, 76, and Peter Browne had a 55 and a bowling effort of 5-16.

Dennis Robbie and Peter Browne improved steadily, becoming potentially the best cricketers on the Plateau. The late Bruce Shearer made up this trio, his short stay at the crease gave over a thousand runs and sixty-two wickets. Bruce caused confusion to opposing batsman by bowling fast medium right hand, and leg-breaks left hand in consecutive overs. The following season, the Boy's Club accepted some enthusiastic adults and the name was changed to the Collaroy Plateau Cricket Club.

Vic Huxley, the all-rounder has taken 368 wickets and scored 1773 runs including 9-59 with this 'slowies'. Chip Browne has scored 3,948 runs with consistent scores in the 60's and 70's and is still the top batsman of the club. Despite a persistent allergy for golf, Chip amassed 311 runs last season in our highest grade A2. A true batsman, Chip has taken 3 wickets bowling 'tripe', and dropped his share of 'sitters' to encourage the bowlers. These two gentlemen, together with our Club President Mr Barry Harland and Mr Ken Hunt have set a standard of participation in cricket, which our club has always proudly maintained. – Milton Lidgard

The small flag, one of many which used to be attached to wooden stakes and employed as boundary markers, was left behind after a match in the late 60's. It is the last known survivor. 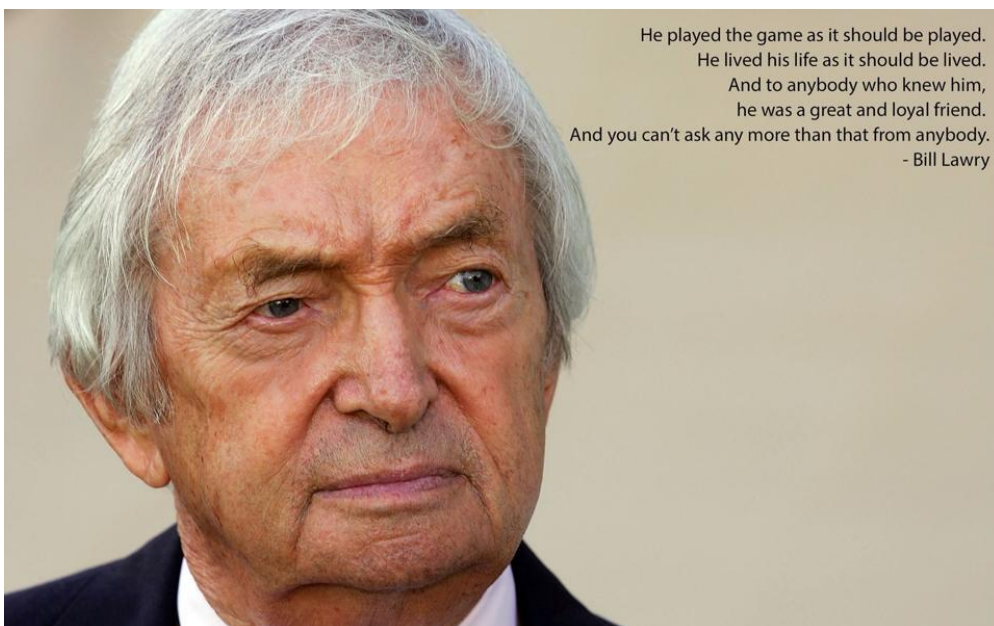
Norm Stephenson

1st Grade

7th Grade

After missing out last season, the Presidents Cup makes a return to the Plateau with CPCC being successful in a nail-biter of a Grand Final. The season included 2 outright wins, 12 first innings wins and 3 first innings losses. The team had a number of changes from last year, with new players Karan Gurnani and Jake Anderson joining the team; Kesh Ratnavibushena, Ryan Blackshaw and Ben Blackshaw becoming regular members and Craig Allomes taking the opportunity to join his son Lachlan. Darren McDermott stepped up to take over the captaincy and along with the other senior players Craig and Andrew "Dee" Davis he set the tone for the season – one where all players, but especially the younger ones, would get an opportunity to play and to improve in a competitive but sporting spirit, which is the supposed idea of the grade.



It was clear following the movements to other teams of last years' top two run scorers that batting would be the greatest challenge for the season. Andrew Davis (166) showed his experience in stabilising a few rocky innings. Sam Filmer-Ramsay (150) was unlucky in not being able to turn a number of starts into higher scores but consistently contributed at number 3 or 4. Lachlan Allomes (147) and Brad Baber (130), both previously better known for their bowling, contributed as hard hitting middle order batsmen while Darren McDermott (106) never let the scoring rate slow. Darren McDermott led well from behind the stumps with 21 catches and 3 stumpings, while Sam Filmer-Ramsay was the standout in the outfield with 15 catches and 3 run-outs. Other notable fielders were Kesh Ratnavibushena and Jake Anderson who showed great athleticism and Ryan Blackshaw who took some amazing slips catches. Special mentions to Oscar Brunton, Nick Brunton and John Jackson who played important cameos during the season; and to Nick Baber for his keenness in the field and support for his teammates.

The chase was off to a rocky start with James falling early and Kesh, Sam and Ryan (15) following to leave the score at 4/24. A quick knock from Lachlan (12) ended when he was run out and then Brad and Dee fell just before stumps, leaving the overnight score at 7/55. So, the Day 2 equation was 44 runs required with 3 wickets in hand. Karan and Darren put on 11 before Karan fell and then it was Ben Blackshaw's moment. Masters

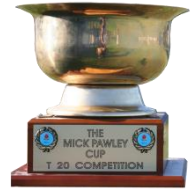

The scorecard of the epic T20 Grand Final at Balgowlah Oval

T20 OGRES

There has to be an investigation! How did The Ogres manage to win a couple of games and come within one ball of making the T20 Plate Final?

After some selective recruitment over the offseason The Ogres came out firing and won the first game of the season (and ever) and then a quarterfinal. Despite our success (!) Junior Secretary's Report

The season of 2014-15 was officially wrapped up at our Junior Presentation evening in May. In a change of format from previous years, the medals and trophies for our 60th Anniversary Season were presented under the stars at our very own 'home of cricket' aka Plateau Park..... and what an exciting and successful season it was!

2014-15 will be remembered as a season of juxtaposition. A season bookended with sadness - the tragic loss of Phillip Hughes at the start of the summer and the passing of the iconic Richie Benaud at its' conclusion - and yet also a season of joy as we celebrated our 60th Anniversary and the achievements of our players. We shared these events as a club and a community, and felt more than ever, the special bond that unites the cricket fraternity around the globe.

Junior Registration numbers remained steady allowing us to form 14 Saturday morning teams, covering all age divisions from U8's through to U16-18's, as well as hosting our well attended Friday evening **In2Cricket** program for U6's. We also continued our successful transition program - Juniors to Seniors- with our 7th Grade development team in the men's afternoon competition, mentored by our resident Club Coach John Jackson. CPCC remains one of the largest clubs in the MWJCA and still one of few that offer cricket opportunities right through from U6 beginners to the highest Grade in the men's Saturday afternoon competition, as well as T20 and Masters.

The Saturday morning competition commenced in September for U10's and up, with the Kanga (U8's) and U9's getting underway later in October. After a season mostly unaffected by rain, the weather was also kind to us for the final day's play, enabling us to happily conclude the club season on the 28th March. The Aussies wrapped up the World Cup soon after and the Sydney Grade Finals were played out with great success to Manly over the Easter weekend. As listed below CPCC finished the season with **4 x Junior Premierships** in the Saturday competition as well as **2 x Junior** titles in the mid-week T20 competition. Those following our Facebook feed will have seen the photos and congratulations messages for these teams as the results came in. These premierships coupled with strong performances across the board from our Junior teams also secured the return of the coveted **MWJCA Club Championship** trophy – a fitting end to our 60th Anniversary season.

In a busy season we also ran our second (and third) very successful CPCC School Holiday Cricket Camps during the October and January school holidays. Expertly coordinated by Martin Haywood and John Jackson the camps were again very popular with our young players and will hopefully be run again this coming season. Players also had the opportunity to sign up for Monday afternoon coaching sessions with our in-house professional coach Mark McInnes. Many players were able to benefit from Mark's expertise at some stage throughout the season either in a team or individual coaching session.

4 teams (U11, U13, U14, U15) were minor premiers with all playing in a home grand final. U13's, 14's and 15's were undefeated in the regular season. U12's finished 4th overall. 3 teams prevailed and won Presidents Cup premierships – U11's, 13's and 15's. This resulted in MWJCA being the overall winners of the Presidents Cup for 2014/15. Further up the ladder again and the pinnacle was Manly Warringah DCC taking out the Sydney 1st Grade Premiership – their first in 26 years!

"The enthusiasm for cricket generated by Chip Browne and Vic Huxley in the local youngsters found its outlet with them playing in the streets after school with the typical fruit case wicket. One such group played regularly that summer of 55' near the first streetlight in Essilia Street up from Ramsay St (now Acacia), even after the lights came on. Some of the boys were Dennis Robbie, Bruce Shearer and a long legged boy in shorts - Ken Hunt.
