

# Season 2023/24

## President's Message

The 2023/24 season was one of CPCC's biggest, with three senior and junior premierships, incredible performances, and a thriving club spirit. From Friday night Cricket Blast to grand final triumphs, it was a season to remember.

Anyone following the Club's Facebook feed would understand what a huge season 2023/24 was for CPCC. The weekly level of activity, action and success started with a number of Club members returning from touring England in the off-season, and concluded with a Finals weekend that returned an unprecedented three Senior Premierships and three Junior Premierships. Crammed in between was everything from the Friday evening Cricket Blast program and bbq to Junior Representative achievements, to a strong and vibrant social scene. Wet weather often threatened, however most of the time we managed to get on and play.

Six out of our seven senior teams entered this season made the semi-finals with five of these teams going through to the Grand Final. Our Flagship Firsts are so close to bringing back the Clifton Leake Shield, our Thirds fought hard to prolong their season and our Sixth Grade showcased some special junior talent well mentored by dedicated dads. Our Seconds defended their crown, the Fourths well and truly erased the GF loss of the previous year and the Fifths somehow defended 75 in a GF thriller. Along the way there were plenty of highlights including Dave Moss's 196 coming within a whisker of the club record for highest score club, Dan McKay's 135 in the Second Grade Grand Final, Juihaar Singh's ten wickets in a fourth-grade match and stalwart Rob Minnett playing his 500th game for the Club. All of this was celebrated in style and comfort at the Dee Why Master Builders Club.

The Juniors had similar on field success with five junior teams playing in the Grand Final and three premierships as a result. On top of this was the achievement of a significant number of our young cricketers being selected in representative teams and carnivals and winning MWJCA awards. Kaya Punter won the outstanding female player and Harvey Matheson the outstanding male player. Harvey and Angus Pike were selected in the NSW U15s Academy squad whilst Kaya travelled to Tasmania to play for the U16 NSW Metro team in the National finals.

Sadly we lost two people associated with the Club from the very first game, Life-member Milton Lidgard and associate June Huxley. Tragically we shared with the local community in mourning the loss of Bec Burns. More details follow later in the report.

All of this can only be achieved by having a strong Committee. With the club continuing to grow and operating a large volunteer community organisation becoming more and more complex, we are fortunate to have a willing and capable club and junior committees. This extends to our participation at the Association level with Andrew Graham succeeding Toby Horstead as Junior Association President and Brodie Elliott continuing on the Senior Association committee as Vice President. Thankyou all for your dedication and energy.

With anticipation we look ahead to 2024/25 where the Club will celebrate our 70th Season.

## Junior Secretary's Message

### The 2023/24 season was remarkable, with strong junior registrations, teams making finals, and outstanding individual achievements. Highlights included a thrilling presentation night, representative success, and a united community.

Plateau Park was the place to be on 16 March 2023 as we celebrated what was a remarkable season for not only our Juniors but our entire Club. As has become tradition our presentation evening was held under the stars at Plateau Park on the last day of play. A day that saw 5 of our Junior teams featuring in grand finals, 6 of our 7 senior teams in semi finals and Club stalwart Dave Moss tonk 196 in front of a Junior crowd gathering for the presentation evening.

Our Junior registrations this season were strong with team numbers returning to pre COVID numbers. We fielded 20 teams in total, this included three Blast competition teams, six stage 1 boys teams, eight stage 2 & 3 boys teams and three girls teams with each age group represented.

Our Friday night Blast Skills programs were once again very popular, we had approximately 30 children participate in our 'Come Try' event conducted by Mikaela Turik at the start of the season, and 50 children participating in our 8-week pre-Christmas and our 4-week term 1 programs. These programs were delivered by our 'home grown' coaches Ollie Fairchild, Charlie Stevenson, Sam Huxley and Nathan McKeever. We also saw our Junior players Grace Pike and Saorise Ford taking on coaching roles with our U11 girls. The highlight of our Friday night training sessions was the weekly BBQ organised by our Blast Coordinator Caroline Wright and her trusty sidekick Sandy 'BBQ King' Wright who wielded the tongs most evenings.

CPCC featured prominently in the finals rounds with 7 teams playing semi finals and 5 teams going through to the grand final. CPCC were guaranteed at least one premiership with our U15/2 teams Power and Surge facing off against one another at Plateau Park. The Power took the win, a remarkable end to what was the first season of cricket for many of the boys in the team.

In a new initiative for the MWJCA an all-girls team (The Allies) comprising of players from across the Association and hosted by Harbord Devils Cricket Club, were entered into the U14/2 Boys Saturday morning competition. The aim was to give the girls additional opportunities to develop their skills. The girls were also required to play for their Club teams on Saturday afternoons, a condition of their participation in the Allies team. The initiative was a success with the team making it to the finals. CPCC had a number of girls in the Allies, CPCC player Teagan Ford won the award for most wickets for the competition.

Our development teams continue to go from strength to strength. In 23/24 CPCC fielded 2 development teams in the MWCA 4th grade competition, both had successful seasons with the 'Blue' team Captained by Andrew Graham making it all the way to the grand final.



Milton Lidgard




CPCC are sad to announce the passing of Life Member & community champion Milton Lidgard. Milton passed away at Lithgow on Friday Night, 17 May 2024 aged 93.

Milton played 169 games over 16 seasons scoring 1583 runs and taking 74 wickets. Milton was one of the 'Originals' being in the squad for CPCC's very first senior match at Dee Why Oval in 1955. It was off the field however where Milton's enormous contributions to the club and community lay. The club for many years revolved around Milton due to his coaching of junior teams, hosting the legendary 'Hut' in his garage in Essilea St, and as Club Historian and mentor.

Milton was club President for 3 seasons from 1968/69 to 1970/71 and Club Historian from 1955 to the late 1990s. Milton's involvement, passion and interest in CPCC remained to the very end. Our club is unique in local park cricket circles due to our comprehensive and continuous historical and statistical records kept diligently by Milton dating back to the Club's very first game in 1955 – a fabulous legacy that we treasure.

# Ten Seasons Ago

## Season 2013/14

Season 2013/14 was a milestone year, with five senior teams reaching finals and three Minor Premierships, including our first-ever Third Grade Premiership. Junior success was also strong, with 16 teams contributing to a thriving cricket community.

With many club members fresh off the plane from another highly successful tour of England, season 2013/14 was always going to carry on this momentum and write another rich page in club history. The season marked ten years of the C Huxley, J Jackson, R Minnett, T Horstead and, V Carden committee – stability and commitment that underpinned much of the club's growth over the past decade. We also entered the season down two stalwarts in Brendan Ball (moved to QLD) and Dom Wheeler (selected for Manly Grade).

All five senior teams made the finals with 3 Minor Premierships and the club's first ever Third Grade Premiership being the rewards. Tom Carden led the 3rds to a fabulous Grand Final victory which saw CPCC's first higher-level title for 8 years. Noteworthy was the participation of English offspinner Rebecca Silk who figured prominently and continued CPCC's proud tradition of pioneering female participation. Keeper Sam Steindl broke his arm just weeks before finals however this didn't stop the team from rolling Wakehurst in the Semi for 24 after scoring 187 – Nirav's 8/11 off 8 and Matt Richard's 2/1 off 8 being classic Nolans finals bowling figures. The Towers were in trouble at 3/5 in the GF before Kav Moorthi's big hitting and partnership with Dave Le got them to 119 and enough runs to win an exciting game.

Fourth and Seventh grade unfortunately lost their GFs. Blake Conde scored the first of his eleven tons (& counting) for the club scoring 111 in the semi. Sevens were unable to continue the club's domination in this age group by chasing down Wakehurst's big total. The tragic passing of Fourth Grade's Nick Eade during the season stunned both the team and the wider club. Other senior club playing activity included another strong showing by the Masters team who without doubt provided the best afternoon teas. Our T20 Towers team was unable to make it three in a row whilst the Ogres were happily outclassed.

Success also shone on our 16 Junior teams with 10/1, 14/1 and U15 premierships. Jake Carden captained Manly Green Shield whilst Nick McLachlan debuted in Manly First Grade. CPCC contributed 31 rep players with Jake Carden, Adrian Caproni, Isaiah Vumbaca and Joel Wood all being selected in their respective age NSW Academy programs. John and Marty Haywood ran a fabulous school holiday coaching clinic on Plateau Park. The Friday evening In2Cricket program led by Toby Horstead was in full swing with many congregating around the

shed for the bbq and drinks each week. The Junior season again wrapped up under sunny skies with the picnic and presentation at Clontarf.

In other news, Cromer Park cricket ground opened. This was the first new cricket ground created in the district for many decades. The Seniors finished off with the end of season trip to Nelson Bay being dominated by still celebrating Second Graders with all enjoying the golf, go karts, brewery and Shoal Bay Country Club. The season concluded at the Brooky Hotel with Liam Filmer-Ramsay taking out the Bruce Shearer Trophy with 1175 points and Dave Moss winning the Randolph.

# England Tour Season 2023/24

In July 2023 CPCC made its long awaited return to the UK. After 10 years since our last visit, a contingent of 17 of our finest clubmen made the journey for our 4th England Tour and 5th International Tour.

In classic Plateau tour fashion we were greeted on day 1 by bus shenanigans when our coach was 45 minutes late to turn up. Luckily it would be relatively smooth sailing from that point. The 2023 tour commenced with a bang at Fleet CC, home of ex Plateau player Jamie Hobdell. Daniel McKay announced himself on the world stage scoring an incredible 120 – his first ever ton. It was a display of power hitting that had the Plateau tourists on the sideline rocking. Dan would continue on to be the leading run scorer for the tour with 248. Sadly we were just 6 runs short of pulling off an incredible victory in this match, but nevertheless it was the quintessential day of tour cricket and the perfect way to introduce our new tourists to what it's all about.

The other incredible individual performance came in our match against Odiham CC. Young gun Darcy Horstead produced his first ever ton when he hit the final ball of the Plateau innings for 4 to finish on 101\*. It was a special moment as father Toby watched on with pride. Darcy also kept very well and went within inches of claiming Frank Huxley trophy.

The other junior on tour Will Graham was also super impressive with his pace bowling; in another memorable moment his dad Andrew defied gravity to take an unbelievable catch off his bowling at Kenn.

Bailey Walz toiled away with the ball all tour to lead the wickets with 15. And there were consistent contributions from all other tourists with both bat and ball and in the field.

Across the three weeks we based ourselves out of Guildford (Sussex), Torquay (Devon), Chester (Cheshire) and Northallerton (Yorkshire) and encountered a huge variety of cricketing experiences; from being served port at lunch in front of a castle, to party cricket with tunes blaring from a speaker all game, to grounds of all shapes, sizes and gradients. Our hosts put on incredible lunches and teas all tour long.

We visited other ex CPCC players Becca Silk at her club Woodbury, Ben Fudali at Newton le Willows, Steve Ollis and Neville Aufrett at Ingleby (sadly washed out) and also Dom and Toby's home towns Overton and Horsley & Send respectively.

We weren't without adversity: injuries and sickness came and went but the tour group remained resilient and in high spirits to fight on through the heavy schedule.

We were able to win 4 out of our 13 matches but were competitive throughout and had a number of close losses that could have gone the other way. Most importantly, the CPCC boat race team remains undefeated.

Our day at the Ashes was a damp one - persistent rain threatened to ruin our chance to see the national side in action. A few lucky tourists took refuge in the Old Trafford member's bar and watched on as Rob got saturated whilst performing an anti-rain dance. It worked – the weather cleared up for long enough to get play underway and we were fortunate enough to see Marnus score a hundred before the remainder of the test was washed out. And as an added bonus we within 1 over of the refund window so the tour fund received a boost!

We capped the tour off with a dinner in York where we collected an incredible £500 in fines (led by the Brick and Brendo who contributed £36 and £35 respectively) and presented the John Jackson Players Player Trophy and the Frank Huxley Touring Trophy to Dom Wheeler who was consistent, whether it was with the bat, ball, behind the stumps or in the outfield, all tour.

There are a million other highlights and stories from the 2023 England Tour, you'll need to ask Rob for his events register to read about everything else!

I hope this reignites our regular touring schedule – our tours are such a unique and special part of our club. The experience is something I can't recommend highly enough and when hopefully a 2027 tour is announced I encourage you to jump in and discover what it's all about!
